PLANES OF ITALY

Italy's best-known bombers are the Savoia-Marchetti 79 and 81 are examples. The S. M. 79, powered with engines of the Bristol-Pegasus type, are the more successful. This aircraft, with a wing span of about 66 feet and a top speed of 270 miles per hour, is roughly comparable in size and speed with the British two-motor Hampden.

Newer are the two-motor Savoia-Marchetti 85 and 86 and the Fiat BR 20. This plane has a speed of about 260 miles per hour and, besides carrying a useful load, mounts four guns. Most of Italy's bombers are more lightly armed.

Of the 2,100 Italian first-line aircraft, there are 340 seaplanes and flying boats. Many are out of date but this high proportion of sea-going craft indicates Italy intends to take advantage of her many island bases. The fastest seaplanes are the little Caronni CA 312 and the big three-motored Cant Z 506B. None compare favorably with the British Sunderland and Lerwick flying boats.

VERY FINE YACHT HERE

One of the most luxurious and trimmest small yachts ever to be seen in Prince Rupert Harbor was the Hope of Bellingham, belonging to Dr. Warren S. Moore. Bellingham surgeon and world traveler, which was in port over Wednesday night tied up at the floats of the Prince Rupert Rowing & Yacht Club. The Hope arrived Wednesday after a cruise to Ketchikan and elsewhere in southeast Alaska and left yesterday in continuation of its return southerly voyage.

The Hope is a brand new boat, built in Bellingham and launched only on May 20. It was designed by the owner and Dr. Moore is fairly proud of the craft which, in addition to being of the very latest stream-lined and up to date model, has many innovations and special features. Among these features are Bendix controls, telephone communication between various parts of the boat, chrome mouldings and numerous other fittings for efficiency and comfort. Thirteen-ply hardwood has been used for the superstructure of the craft.

Forty feet in length overall, the Hope has a beam of 11 feet eight inches. The power plant is a Gray 6-105 with 1 1/2 to 1 reduction gear. The maximum speed is seventeen miles per hour. Don Cruson of Bellingham is making the trip as crew member.

Dr. Moore is a well known sport salmon fisherman and has travelled extensively. He spent fourteen years in France teaching surgery and has also been in India and other countries.

Accompanying the Hope on its cruise is the Liberty of Bellingham, having on board Mr. and Mrs. Petersen and Mr. and Mrs. Moffatt. This is a 36 foot vessel of 11 1/2 feet beam, equipped with an 85 h.p. Chris Craft engine. She is of the sedan cruiser type.
