LOCAL MARINE NOTES. The Camosun will sail this evening at 7 p.m. The Cheloshin is due from the south Tuesday night. The Princess Beatrice is due from the south Tuesday. Princess May, northbound, is due tomorrow. The Princess Ena, with a full cargo of freight will be here on Monday. The British Empire arrived at 3 a.m. with cannery supplies for Work Island and Naden Harbor. The Henriette arrived this morning with a full cargo of pipe and bridge steel for the railway. The C.P.R. service to this port will be further augmented on June 1st by the Princess Mary of the Princess Sophia. The Curacao came in at 5 a.m. with fifteen passengers for this port from Alaska. This is her last trip on this run. The excursion steamer Spokane leaves Seattle at 9 a.m. April 2nd, arriving here on Thursday. This will be her maiden trip to this port. She will alternate with the City of Seattle until June, when she will resume her regular excursions to the Alaska glaciers and will be replaced by the State of California. The Princess Royal leaves Vancouver every Wednesday at 10 p.m., arriving here at 1 p.m. Friday. She will leave at 9 a.m. every Saturday for Port Simpson and Granby Bay, formerly called Goose Bay, returning from there to Prince Rupert at 8 a.m. Sunday, and sailing for Vancouver at 9 p.m., arriving there at 9 a.m. Tuesday. The Princess Royal has been on the Vancouver-Victoria run and Agent McNab says she underwent a thoroughly overhauling and repainting before coming on this run again. W. H. CITY COUNCIL AND APOLOGY (Continued from Page 1.) in favor of another of the candidates. This he thought was coming rather strong in the political sense for a council which had almost sworn to eschew politics entirely in favor of the untrammelled conduct of the city's business. Ald. Morrissey thought the dispute might very well be settled between the mayor and Ald. Clayton outside of the council in the way all gentlemen settled their differences. Ald. Montgomery felt that if a slip had been made as Ald. Bullock-Webster suggested, then it more became the mayor or any other alderman guilty of such slip to apologize for it than to allow the matter to breed a breach in the council board.

Dybhavn Disappointed. Ald. Dybhavn, who seldom speaks much in council, expressed himself very much disappointed at the stand the mayor had taken in this campaign after the council had practically promised the citizens as regards their attitude to politics. He supported Ald. Morrissey in the feeling that grievances between members of the council might well be settled out of council. Alderman Maitland was of the same opinion strongly, and Ald. Douglas added his voice to the general strain.

On a motion being put to leave the matter to be settled between the mayor and Ald. Clayton personally without council interference, the measure carried unanimously.

CONAN DOYLE AND IRELAND. Famous Author Makes Graphic Speech at Liberal Colonial Club in Favor of Passing Home Rule Bill Unanimously. London, March 26.—Speaking at the dinner of the Liberal Colonial Club, at which he presided last night, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle made an appeal for justice to Ireland. If England, he said, in a good cause drew her sword then they knew the swords of fifty allied colonies and dependencies would spring from their sheaths. Only one would be wanting and that not the least sharp or heavy. The sword of Ireland would remain sullenly by its side. "We cannot allow that," he continued. "We want the gallant race upon our side. It would be a great thing if the gift of national self government could have come from England to Ireland, not from an English party to Ireland. It is a pity the measure could not be unanimous, but that is not to be, and we must gird up our loins for a long fight. But if we fight patiently with the weapons of logic and charity we surely will win."
