ANTHONY EDEN'S VIEW

Some year ago Right Hon. Anthony Eden was removed from office because he did not agree with the policy of the British government of that day. His policy was one of distrust of the axis powers and of the desirability at that time of taking a firm stand against the spread of Fascism and Naziism. Today this same man is Secretary of State for War in the Churchill administration and he is just as firm and determined and sane in his views as he was then. He says the British have all the chances in their favor and will win the war but it will be long and bitterly! contested. When the attempt at invasion has failed, as fail it will, the British will have to invade the European continent and already Mr. Eden, as war minister, is making plans to carry out this work. The British policy is not only a policy for the moment but for next year and the year after. There will be no appeasement this time. Nothing but complete victory will satisfy the British.
