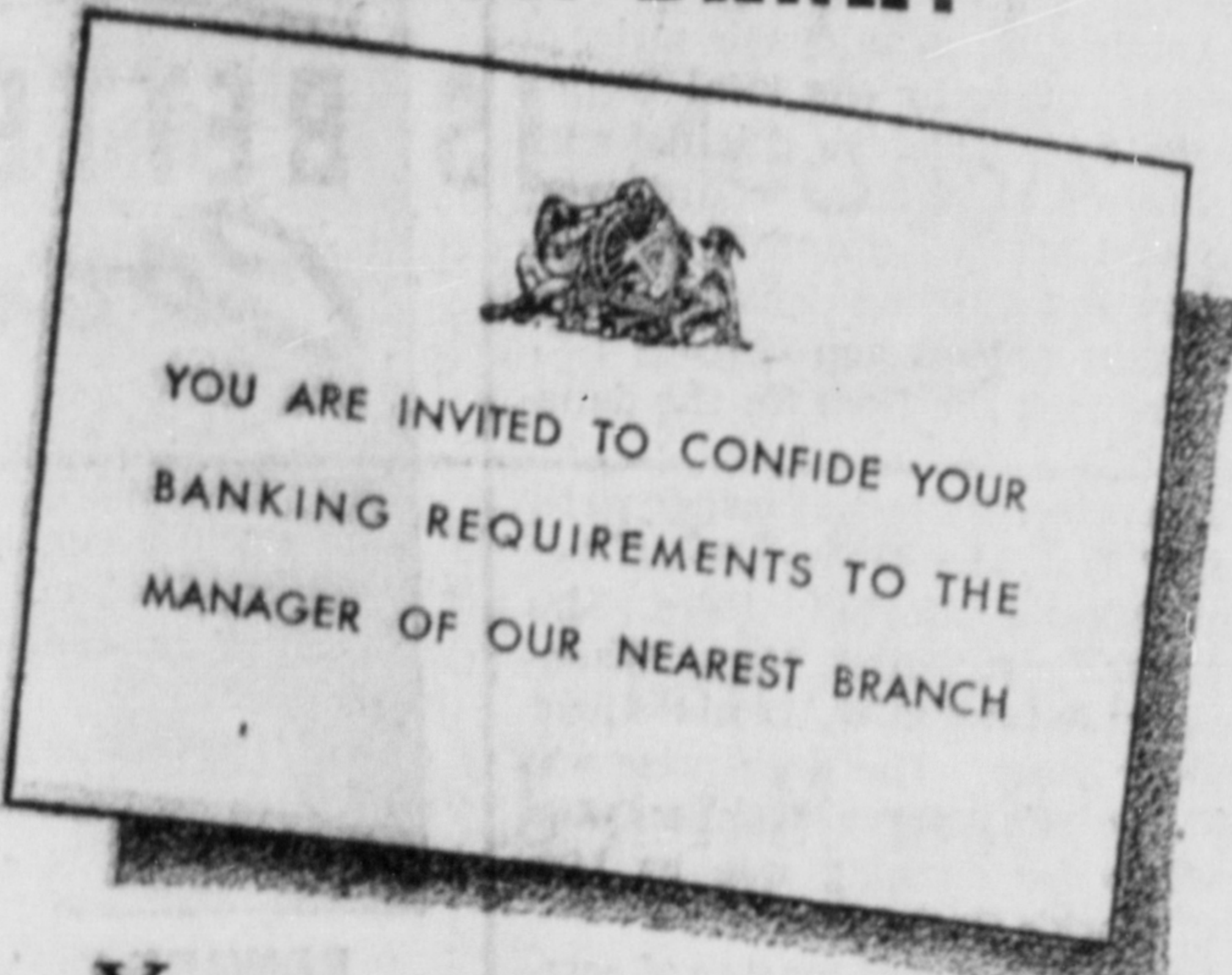

From The Waterfront

The Department of Transport is advising mariners that the day beacon on Regatta Rock in Seaford Channel, south of Prince Rupert in the Bella Bella region, has been destroyed by stress of weather.

On a regularly scheduled voyage to Alaska, C. P. R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. S. K. Gray, arrived in port at 8:30 this morning from Vancouver, sailing an hour later for Skagway. The vessel is scheduled to call here again next Monday afternoon south-bound. There were sixty-eight passengers going north on the vessel. One disembarked at this port and one went aboard here.

Alaska Transportation Co.'s steamer Taku arrived in port at 8 o'clock this morning from the north and, after discharging fish from Ketchikan for transshipment East over Canadian National Railways, sailed at 11 a.m. in continuation of her voyage to Seattle.

George Weaver of New Westminster, C. C. F. candidate for Skeena in the federal election, came north from Vancouver this week on the steamer Prince John to commence his campaign on the Queen Charlotte Islands. He will later visit the city and the interior. Mr. Weaver was last here on the occasion of the provincial election in which he was a candidate.
