

Blow For Blow To Get Victory

British Peer Says Harsh and Iron Determination Needed by British

LONDON, Oct. 26: (CP)—Britain must return "blow for blow" with harsh and iron determination," says Lord Queenborough.

Every further breach of international law and civilized practice by the enemy must be ruthlessly countered," Lord Queenborough declares. "Our native traditions of fair play and generosity to an opponent are deeply ingrained in us. To abandon them, even now is hard and distasteful.

"To cling to them in the face of the enemy's open and loudly proclaimed brutality and treachery is to add to our own dangers and offer advantages to the enemy which he will not fail to grasp.

"We no longer have the right to follow our inclinations—in the name of our own life we must return blow for blow with harsh and iron determination."
