

"Those who feel] that for professional or other reasons they require to make expenditures of a special character should communicate with the board," the announcement said.

To firms on the border whose business requires that their employees shall make frequent business trips to the United States, the board will issue special cards which may be validated by an officer of the firm for each separate trip.



# These are typical of the guestions the women of Canada will be asked when they register

HE human resources of the nation must find their fullest and freest expression. The abilities A and powers of our women must be mobilized as well as that of our men. Registration is the first necessary step. Since the outbreak of hostilities, the women of Canada have individually, through Church, Red Cross, Women's Clubs and other organizations, responded magnificently to the urgent call of the nation. In addition to these, however, there are thousands of others who, within the limits of their time and capacity, are anxious and willing to do their bit. National Registration will open up for these women new opportunities for national service. Many positions left vacant by men who have enlisted, or will enlist, will have to be filled. Many men, now employed, because of necessary transfer to war work, may have to be replaced by women.

# REGISTRATION DATES: August 19th, 20th, 21st

VOLUNTEER WORKERS NEEDED—The work entailed in registering more than eight million people in three days will be enormous. Volunteer workers will be welcomed. As an immediate way of assisting you are invited to get in touch with your local registration officials and offer your services.

#### WHERE TO REGISTER

Registration offices are being set up by electoral districts in the same manner as in the last Dominion election.

Registrants are required to register in the regular polling subsome other province or district out of the regular polling subdivision on Registration Days, he or she may register at any registration office convenient, upon satisfactory explanation to the local deputy registrar.

#### Your Registration Certificate

To every person answering the questionnaire fully and satisfactorily a certificate of registration will be issued by the local deputy registrar. This is a small card which must be carried on the person at all times.

Penalty for Non-Registration - Failure to register will make any male or female, married or single, over the age of 16 years, liable to a fine not exceeding Two hundred dollars, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding Three months, or to both such fine and imprisonment, and moreover to a further penalty not exceeding Ten dollars for each day, after the day upon which he should have registered, during which he shall continue to be unregistered.
