AID FROM GOV'T IN BUILDING

Former City Commissioner Urges New Move Under Federal Housing Plan—New Homes Is Crying Need

"The crying need of Prince Rupert is for new homes and the only feasible way to get them is through the federal housing plan," declared W. J. Alder, former city commissioner, who left for the south last night after visiting a week in the city and looking after his interests. "Practically every city in southern British Columbia has availed itself of government help in their home building campaigns and building campaign—and building booms are in evidence everywhere. Prince Rupert has greater need than most cities and surely is entitled to the same privilege. Those citizens who formerly opposed the building of more homes must now see that it is a necessity.

"The city of Victoria during the past year made available for immediate building 100 fifty-foot lots where city services were available at \$50 a lot. May I suggest that this city be approached for some such concession and every citizen put his shoulder to the wheel to relieve the present shortage of accommodation. The city that ceases to build will gradually die."

Mr. Alder upon being asked for his impression on what undoubtedly is a changed city said it must be borne in mind that there could be no real prosperity or success for any city or individual until the war was won but it was apparent to everyone that Prince Rupert was today more prosperous than it has been for many years. Steady work had put new life into many a home and driven away the bogey of poverty. Merchants seemed to be all doing well and new faces among the civilian population were everywhere in evidence.

"Under my observation," said the former commissioner, "this city has grown in thirty-one years from a dozen children and a few hundred adults without streets or city conveniences to its present status. A no time in its history has it been in a better position to consolidate its gains. Eight years ago the city was broke and the outlook poor but, thanks to the splendid co-operation of the taxpayers, the net debt is smaller than it has been for twenty years and its credit in financial circles is now as good as most cities of its size in British Columbia. New industries have increased the city payroll and its strategic location on the Pacific coast is at last generally recognized. One must be a pessimist indeed to look at the huge government undertakings and not see in them assurance of permanent upkeep."

WHOLE GREEN TOMATO PICKLES
 1 gallon small green tomatoes
 2 cups cider vinegar
 4 cups brown sugar
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 teaspoon mixed pickle spice
 10 whole cloves
 Cook tomatoes 12 minutes in boiling water, a few at a time. Remove each tomato carefully, drain thoroughly and place in a jar. Boil a syrup of other ingredients. Boil 5 minutes. Strain over tomatoes. Seal tightly.
