## Waterfront Whiffs

Local Dry Dock Receives Confirmation of Contract—Herring Seining to Close In Local Harbor

Thomas Boulter, superintendent of the Prince Rupert dry dock, late yesterday afternoon received confirmation of announcements received in other quarters earlier in the day that the Prince Rupert dry dock had been awarded contracts from the federal War Purchasing Board for the building of two 170-foot steel mine sweepers at a cost of some \$1,250,000. Another confirmation came in a message from Hon. W. J. Asselstine, minister of trade and industries at Victoria, that, of fourteen minesweepers to be built in British Columbia, two would be constructed at Prince Rupert. Canadian National Railways officials at Vancouver earlier in the day had said they were unable to confirm the report that their dry dock was handling two mine sweepers. Evidently, they did receive word later, Mr. Boulter's message indicating this. Burrard and North Vancouver shipbuilding companies at Vancouver each said they would employ seven to eight hundred men on their contracts. The Prince Rupert contract will involve three months' preparatory work and work on actual construction for some five hundred men for about eight months. Yarrows and the Victoria Machinery Depot have also received contracts, two each.

Union steamer Cardena, Capt. John Boden, arrived in port at 5 o'clock this morning from the south and sailed at 8 a.m. on her return to Vancouver and waypoints. Herring seining, which has been continuing on a substantial scale in Prince Rupert harbor with many seiners and packers engaged in handling it, will be closed down next week. There was a particularly heavy run at the first of the week when as much as 2,000 tons was hauled in on a single night.

Having been delayed by heavy traffic for Island points, C. N. R. steamer Prince John, Capt. James Watt, arrived in port at midnight last night from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands and will sail tonight on her return south via the same route. Establishment of a new unwatched light on the northwest point of Watcher Island, Browning Passage, Smith Sound, is announced by the Department of Transport. It is a white acetylene flasher from a lens lantern on a pole with concrete foundation at an elevation of thirty-five feet.

The Armour Salvage Co. fleet has been busy these days on a variety of jobs. The company's power tug Bonilla, Capt. Henry Hansen, is due in port at 6 o'clock this evening from Vancouver after an absence since December. She is bringing in two 550-ton scows containing 350,000 feet of creosoted timber to be used in the construction of the Hays Creek and Westview bridges for the city. While absent in the south, the Bonilla was given an overhaul and has been engaged in towing logs from Johnstone Straits camps as well as towing herring scows to the Namu reduction plant.

The steam tug Fearless, Capt. Reg Green, and power tug Pachena, Capt. Oscar Sather, returned to port today from Anyox bringing in one hundred creosoted piles which the Armour company has purchased from the wreckage of the old smelter plant, also a 20,000 gallon oil tank and a scowload of mining material to be transhipped over the Canadian National Railways to Vanderhoof.

At the end of last week the Pachena towed back to Tanoan Inlet, Queen Charlotte Islands, two camp tenders for the Kelley Log-

It was expected to refloat the scow today and bring her in for repairs.

During the first week in March it is expected to send the power tugs Pachena and Bonilla to Vancouver with four scowloads of material taken out by the A. R. Williams Machinery Co. in wrecking the Anyox plant and a scowload of equipment which the Northern Construction Co. has been using on the fortification contracts here.
