MILES IN CANADA FASTER THAN 1.40

Longboat Set Too Fast a Pace in the Beginning - The Indian Pleased the Spectators The Powderhall Marathon is described by the Sporting Life as follows: "The pace was a cracker from the outset. Longboat broke away in the first mile, run in 4 min. 55 sec., 16 sec. faster than Bouchard's time last year. Two miles in 10.7 was astounding for a Marathon - 27 sec. ahead of Needless to say, by this time Longboat was out on his own, and he kept clear of his field for a full hour without any signs of flagging, but then he began to slack. At ten miles, it may be remarked, he was out a second ahead of last year's leader's figures, and from then he dropped gradually behind till at 15 he was 1 min. 37 sec. behind, but still well ahead of his field. The effort had been too much, however, and as the lapped men overhauled him again and went away, cutting down his lead only too decisively, the Indian faltered and finally stopped. He had set out to break up his field - but neither Holmer nor Kolehmainen was to be taken along at a pace which they knew would crack them, and so the Indian only beat himself.

A BOXING FIASCO An English Paper Refers to the Storbeck-Moran Bout Many lessons may be learned from the contest in England between Fred Storbeck (South Africa) and Frank Moran (United States). First of all the bout was quite unpretty because of the crudeness of the two exponents, who did little beyond punch in unsullied fashion. Moreover there was a distinct suspicion that the South African, who was well ahead on points when disqualified, went to the floor of the ring twice without being hit. This sort of thing, suggestive of cowardice, is not forgivable, but the two boxers were so clumsy of movement that it may be Storbeck's seeming misdeed was merely the consequence of inability to move rapidly and retain his equilibrium. On one occasion, however, when, from a crouching position, he merely bent his knees and placed his gloves upon the floor, Storbeck might have been disqualified without any undue harshness on the part of the referee. The striking of the blows after the ringing of the bell at the end of the seventh round was due to two things - Storbeck's eagerness to win and the Christmas-tide nature of the bout. The Ring officials should learn the lesson of this fiasco and obtain a gong that can be heard above the murmur of excited onlookers. - English Exchange.

The latter is the good Order horse that won so many high-class races for the orange and green, while Red Fox is a son of the mighty Flying Fox, and the only one on this continent. He is a picture of a horse, and, though he came out here with the reputation of possessing a bad temper, he is now an animal of admirable disposition, and anybody can handle him without difficulty. In the Argentine Republic, where he was bred, two sons of Flying Fox, which cost their owners \$150,000 and \$140,000 respectively, have been most successful sires. The horses in training at Brookdale include two slashing King's Flaturs, Hersey, by Sain, and Tropeolum, by Nasturtium.
