Waterfront Whiffs

Big Construction Job at Seal Cove Proceeding Apace—Concrete Pouring Next Week—Halibut Landings Continue Substantial

The big construction project at Seal Cove is proceeding steadily. Rapid progress is being made by the E. J. Ryan Contracting Co. which has the work in hand. The scene there has already been greatly changed as a result of the extensive excavation work. The job has reached a point where the pouring of concrete for retaining walls will be continued next Monday. Seal Cove continues about the busiest place around Prince Rupert these days.

Armor Salvage Co.'s service boat Bonilla, Capt. Henry Hansen, with derrick scow equipment, left Thursday night for Hastings Arm to get a load of gravel to be used in connection with the work at Seal Cove.

The big power cruiser Audrey W., purchased recently by the Armour Salvage Co. from the estate of the late Len Weaver, is now moored at the company floats. Future disposition of the vessel has not yet been decided upon. She is equipped with a 20 h.p. Easthope engine.

The sage of New Hazelton, Chuck Sawle, publisher of the Omineca Herald, observes: "There is one thing—if the boats to be built at Prince Rupert are not ready for this war they will be for the next one. There is nothing like being prepared in advance."

Keel Blocks Laid
 Keel blocks have been laid at the local dry dock for the two minesweepers to be built at the yard for the federal government. Steel deliveries have commenced and actual construction will soon be under way. The boats will be built at the same point in the yard where the last war shipbuilding was carried out. Work of general preparation at the plant for the new shipbuilding proceeds steadily.
