LONDON, Dec. 20: (CP)—Mrs. Caroline Roberts' home has a gaping bomb hole in the roof but she refused to leave for a safer refuge because of her friends—the animals. Scores of cats in one of London's most heavily bombed districts made

their way to the 65-year-old widow's home every night after the alert has sounded. There they find supper and a fire beside which they lie and purr all night.

"When the bombs fall particularly close, I go under the stairs and the cats follow me there," said Mrs. Roberts. Cats aren't the only visitors, however. In the morning, 50 pigeons, whose loft in a nearby church was disturbed by a bomb, show up at the front door for a breakfast of crumbs.

CANADIANS AT BRISTOL

English West Coast City Organizes For Entertainment of Troops

BRISTOL, Eng., Dec. 20: (CP)—Royal Empire Society members of Bristol, recently bombed heavily by German air raids, have inaugurated a plan for organized entertainment of Canadian troops, a practice they hope will be adopted throughout the United Kingdom.

The idea was formed by Society members in collaboration with members of the Bristol Canadian Club, who invited 16 officers and privates from different Canadian units, chosen at random, to spend three days in the city.

During the three days the Canadians were taken on tours of the city and neighboring towns and later were guests of individual members with whom they were billeted. Part of the program was allotted to individual entertainment by club members who devised various ways of keeping their guests "on the go" for three full days.

The Canadians were given a block of seats at a special football game; were guests at luncheons and were given a special reception by the dean at the Bristol Cathedral.

One of the hosts expressed the hope Bristol's welcome would "break the ice and that all the hosts will invite their guests to return some time, or else invite other Canadian troops to visit them."

Here's How to Mix and Serve 'em

RYE

RYE HIGHBALL—1 jigger B.C.D. Canadian Rye Whisky, 2 cubes of ice, 1 twist lemon peel. Fill glass with ginger ale or soda.

OLD FASHIONED—Muddle one-half lump sugar, teaspoon water and dash bitters. Add cube of ice, half slice orange, stick of pineapple, slice of lemon and maraschino cherry. Fill with a B.C.D. Canadian Rye Whisky.

GIN

COLLINS—Use tall glass, two or three cubes of ice, juice of 1/2 lemon, teaspoon sugar, 2 ounces Monogram Gin. Fill glass with soda water.

GIN FIZZ—Shake well, 1 cocktail glass Monogram Gin, 1/3 white of 1 egg, 1/2 tablespoon sugar, 3 dashes lemon juice, cube of ice. Strain into tall glass and fill with soda water.

WHISKY

HOT TODDY—Dissolve 1/2 teaspoon sugar in a little hot water. Stir in Speyside Liqueur Whisky to taste, grate nutmeg on top.

HIGHBALL—Add a jigger of Sheriff's Gold Bond Whisky to lump of ice in highball glass. Fill with soda water.

WHISKY SOUR—2/3 shaker of shaved ice, wine glass Five Scots Whisky, 4 dashes each of syrup and lemon juice.

HOT WHISKY FLIP—Mix yolk of egg, teaspoon sugar, wine glass Caledonia Liqueur Whisky in glass. Fill half full with very hot water. Sprinkle nutmeg on top.

RHUM

HOT RHUM—Add three parts very hot weak tea, or water, to 1/2 teaspoon sugar and a jigger of Rhum Negrita. Serve with a slice of lemon.
