The governors trying for the Senate are Cochran of Nebraska and Aiken of Vermont. Former governors in the running are Nice of Maryland, Benson of Minnesota and Langer of North Dakota.

Representatives Barton of New York, Murdock of Utah, Wallgren of Washington and Lemke of North Dakota are also Senate nominees.

Of the 35 seats at stake, 25 now are held by Democrats, eight by Republicans and one each by Progressives and Farmer-Labor. The Senate standing is: 69 Democrats, 23 Republicans and one each of Independents, Farmer-Labor and Progressives. There is one vacancy.

Among the best known senators seeking re-election are Anthur Vanderburg, Republican, Michigan; Burton K. Wheeler, the Montana Isolationist - Democrat; Key Pittman, Democrat of Nevada, the administration's right hand man in foreign policy, Albert (Happy) Chandler, Kentucky's former Democratic Governor; Joseph Guffey, Democrat of Pennsylvania, and Robert M. LaFollette, Wisconsin Progressive.
