**Nerves Shattered By War's Ordeals**

Hypnotic Treatment Aided in Restoring Soldier and Sailor to Normal Health

LONDON, Aug. 20: (CP)—A British soldier who shot his mortally wounded brother to hasten his death on the sands at Dunkirk was a nervous wreck until hypnotic treatment revealed the reason for his strange nervous ailment, a writer disclosed in a recent issue of Lancet, British medical magazine.

The writer, Dr. William Sargent, psychiatric specialist, cited this and another case to show beneficial results of hypnotic treatment. The illness puzzled Dr. Sargent and inducing the soldier to describe the frightfulness on the beach also failed to provide a basis on which to formulate a cure.

Under hypnosis, however, the soldier gave Dr. Sargent a clear picture of his ordeal beside his brother. The incident had tortured the soldier's mind but he could not remember what he had done, except when hypnotized. After the doctor heard the story he was able to treat the man who quickly regained his health.

Another case was that of a tormented merchant seaman who confessed under hypnosis, that he felt responsible for the death of his best friend, who until he sank, had been swimming at his side.

When the sailor became conscious after the hypnotic treatment he was told the story and assured by the doctor that he had no cause for self-recrimination. His worries vanished.

Previously the Australian Meat Board had considered that the prices paid by Britain for mutton and second quality beef had been too low and it had been decided to ask for a premium on "Down" lamb in view of actual war developments. It has been decided that a revision of the contract on present prices will be acceptable.

"A forecast by the British Ministry of Agriculture for a new national diet based on more fruit and vegetables and less meat, with particularly generous rations of potatoes is recognized here as possibly meaning a revolution in Australian farming and the subject has been much discussed in the newspapers and agricultural circles.

A reduction of British meat eating habits which may well become permanent would mean a change-over in production in Australia.
