EDITORIALS

UNEXPECTED STRIKE

When the German or Italian torpedo struck the British steamer Arandora Star it is hardly likely the commander of the attacking vessel knew his own countrymen were aboard. Evidently the ship was not being convoyed as the attack would not have been expected. While the sinking of the ship relieves Canada of keeping the interned, it is not the kind of war that anyone likes to wage.

BEING ABLE TO SWIM

Recurring drowning fatalities due to the inability of the victims to take care of themselves in the water draw attention to the importance of children being taught to swim—not only that they may be able to enjoy a pleasant and healthful form of exercise but so that, under an emergency, they may be in a position to save their own lives or to assist in the saving of lives of others.

In the past there has been too little in Prince Rupert in the way of organized swimming instruction, either free or otherwise. This year, it has been announced, free swimming instruction will be one of the features of the Gyro Club's supervised playground activities here. For the younger children there will be classes at the McClymont Park pool and for more advanced pupils at Morse Creek with competent instructors in charge in each case.

The expectation is that there will be a large measure of response to the opportunity thus being offered the children to learn the very important accomplishment of being able to swim.

AIDING THE RED CROSS

Official moving pictures of the Royal Visit to Canada last year are being shown at the Capitol Theatre here tonight and tomorrow. In this connection, it is announced that all the net proceeds from this picture—that is the profits of both producers and exhibitors—are being turned over to the Red Cross for war work. In addition, the Red Cross will benefit through the government having not assessed its costs in connection with the production. Further, these donated proceeds are paid direct to the local Red Cross Societies in the cities where the film is shown.

By going to the showing of the Royal Visit pictures, therefore, one not only sees a highly interesting film display but also part of the admission he pays goes to what is regarded as one of the most important phases of work in connection with the caring of the victims of war and alleviating suffering in connection therewith.

CLEVELAND NOW LEADS

Indians Go Back On Top In American League As Result Of Bob Feller's Victory

NEW YORK, July 4: (CP)—In yesterday's major league baseball games the Brooklyn Dodgers moved from second into first place when they defeated the New York Giants. The former league leaders, the Cincinnati Reds, dropped into second place. The Boston Bees took the Philadelphia Phillies while the Pittsburgh Pirates went down to the Chicago Cubs.

In the American League the Cleveland Indians went back on top when they defeated the St. Louis Browns, largely through the fine pitching of Bob Feller. The Detroit Tigers went back to second place after a short stay on top when they lost to the Chicago White Sox. In the third scheduled game the Boston Red Sox beat the Philadelphia Athletics.
