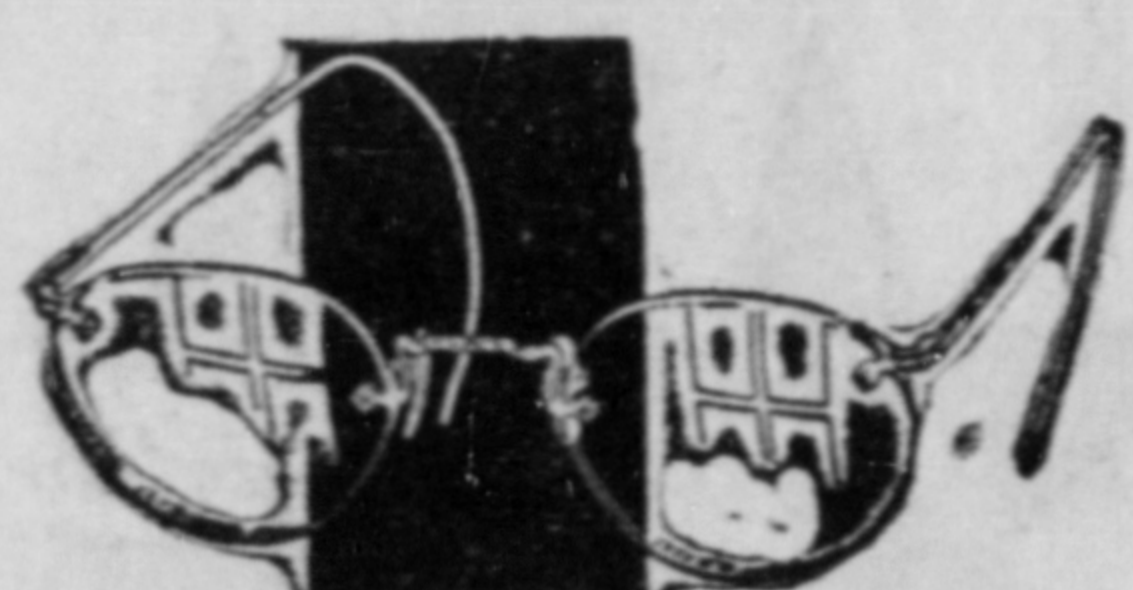

L. Mackenzie King announces. R. J. Tallon, secretary-treasurer of the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada, and Allan M. Mitchell of Montreal will be the two other members.

CANADIANS
TAKE OVER

United States Destroyers Are Com-
missioned in Dominion Navy

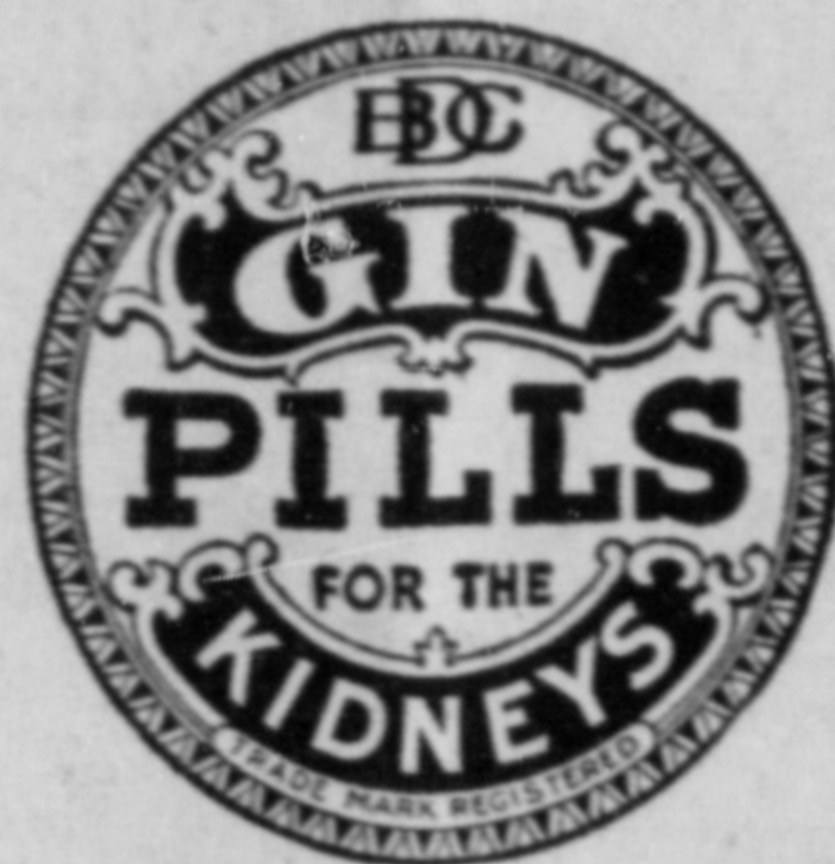
HALIFAX, Sept. 25.—Six over-age destroyers obtained from the United States were commissioned as Canadian vessels yesterday. Royal Canadian Navy crews went aboard. The destroyers will be used in trans-Atlantic convoy service, starting duty immediately as escorts. The recent acquisition of these vessels swells the Dominion's destroyer fleet to thirteen ships.

Union steamer Catala, Capt. James Findlay, arrived in port at 9:30 last night from Stewart and other northern points and sailed a couple of hours later for Vancouver and waypoints. The vessel had been delayed by loading canned salmon on the Naas River.
