C. P. R. steamer Princess Char-
lotte, which stranded in Tolmie
Channel near Boat Bluff last
week, damaging her propeller and
rudder and becoming un navigable,
is now at Victoria for repairs. The
vessel was towed south from
Klemtu at the end of the week by
the company's tug Kyoquot.

Northland Transportation Co.'s
motorship Northland, Capt. Len
Williams, southbound from Ket-
chikan to Seattle, was in port from
3 to 5:45 p.m. yesterday discharg-
ing fish from Alaska for trans-
shipment East over Canadian Na-
tional Railways.

The freighter Gray, under char-
ter to the Frank Waterhouse line
with Capt. E. B. Allen in com-
mand, was in port from 8 o'clock
to 11 yesterday morning bound
from Vancouver to Taku with a
cargo of coal and general for the
Tulsequah mine. The call was
made here for water.

For the past few days there has
been a decided pick-up in the coho
run at Dundas and Wark Canal.
Fishermen are all making a few
dollars following a week during
which there was hardly a fish
coming.

Running a day late, C. P. R.
steamer Princess Louise, Capt. S.
K. Gray, arrived in port at 9
o'clock this morning on her way
from Vancouver to Skagway, sail-
ing at 10 a.m. The vessel is sched-
uled to call here southbound on
Saturday afternoon. The Louise
had on board 68 passengers of
whom 18 disembarked here while
sixteen went aboard here for the
north.

Union steamer Catala, Capt.
James Findlay, is due back in port
at 4:15 this afternoon, fog condi-
tions permitting, from Stewart
and other northern points. The
vessel will sail soon thereafter in
continuation of her voyage to
Vancouver and waypoints.
