

# CONFERENCE To Retire Soon

Alex Sinclair Of Local Fishermen's Co-operative Attended Important Gathering In Vancouver

Alex Sinclair, manager of the Prince Rupert Fishermen's Co-Operative Association, returned to the city on the Prince Rupert this morning from Vancouver where he attended the third annual Fishermen's Co-operative Conference. C. Phillips of the Prince Rupert Co-operative acted as chairman of the Conference.

It was reported that the combined production of fish of the associations represented was ap- Nominations proximately five million pounds. The total sales of commodities and supplies approximated \$189,500. Are Approved Total cost of merchandise sold was 154,000. Total operating expenses of stores were \$16,128, yielding a net surplus of \$10,375.

Besides comparing the last year's operations and discussing the merits of various operating methods, the conference also dealt comprehensively with marketing problems, insurance, fish conservation, and a number of other matters of vital importance to the organizations represented.
