JAPS URGE ASSAULT ON BRITAIN

TOKYO-Domei News Agency, in a special article today, urged the Axis powers to terminate the war with Russia so as to conserve German resources in manpower and equipment for an all-out assault upon Britain. Domei warned that the war with Russia, if extended, might leave the Axis powers faced with a dearth of materials. Tokyo newspapers today blaned Washington for what they called strengthening and spread of encirclement of Japan and said the Pacific situation was deteriorating.

CANADIAN NEWSMEN BLITZED

LONDON - Visiting Canadian newspaper representatives who had not heard an air raid siren once during their fortnight's tour of Britain were given a taste of Nazi air war on the eve of departure.
