sailors and passengers on the ship who laid down their lives that others might be saved.

"We are a company of people representing all parts of the city gathered together, as cities all over the world are doing, the same one great sympathetic heart in this hour of a great calamity," said Rev. Warren H. McLeod. Continuing he said, in part: "No matter whether we were pauper or millionaire, or what our faith or creed or politics may be, in an hour of calamity we are on a common ground, bound together in the spirit of brotherhood."

The musical part of the service consisted of a quartet by Mrs. Jarvis McLeod, Mrs. Nehar, Mr. Clapperton and Mr. Davey. Mrs. Carpenter most capably acted as pianist and Miss Dineen beautifully rendered a solo.

The closing hymn was "Nearer My God to Thee," the hymn said to have been the last played by the Titanic's stringed orchestra as the great ship went down.

Rev. Mr. Bushbrook then pronounced the benediction, the great crowd which thronged the theatre standing in hushed reverence. So Prince Rupert paid solemn tribute to the memory of those who met death in the most awful marine disaster yet recorded.

The Army Corps in Rupert, Under Captain Kerr, also Memorialized the Titanic Disaster with Solemnity.

Apparently through an oversight, the Salvation Army Corps in Prince Rupert received no notification of the joint memorial service to the Titanic disaster victims, and the army was thus not represented on the platform at the opera house. A special memorial service was held in the evening, however, at the Salvation Army Citadel, and a large number of citizens interested in the work took part. This memorial service was held by Captain Kerr in accordance with instructions from headquarters, and in no spirit of rivalry with the other arrangements, he having, in fact, signified his willingness to abandon his usual afternoon service in favor of the joint memorial service.
