## German Air Force Numbers 200,000

**This Is Estimate Of Foreign Military Attaches In London**

LONDON, Nov. 15: (P)—Foreign military attaches in Berlin estimate that German air troops total 200,000 men. Of these about a fifth are paratroops and the remaining 160,000 air-borne troops. The average German glider can carry 10 fully-equipped men. It is stated, and a Junkers 52 transport aircraft can carry 25 men and tow two gliders. Therefore 200 Junkers could transport an attacking force of 9,000 men.

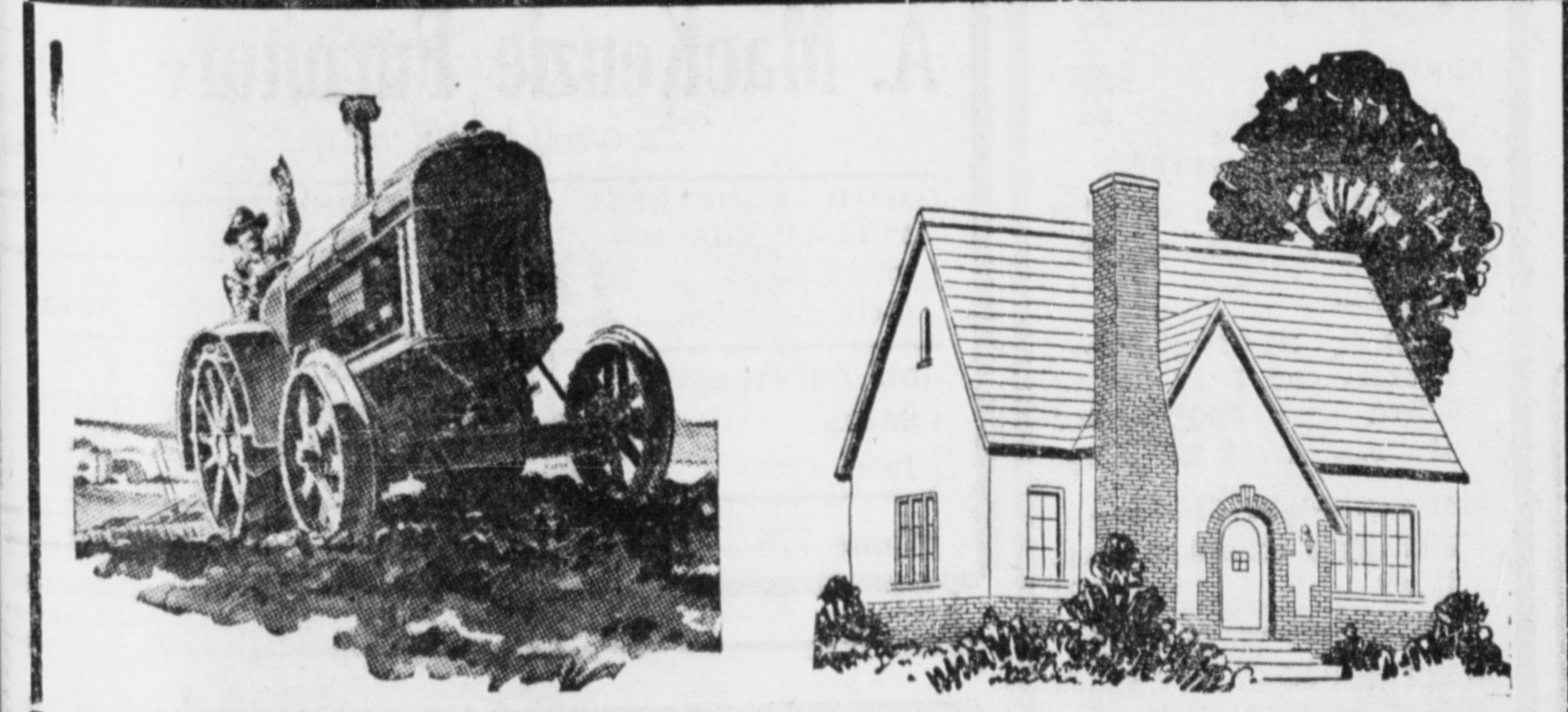
