
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CATHEDRAL MARRIAGE

Poignant Drama, One Of Popular Series, Featured At Capitol Today And Tomorrow

"Dr. Kildare's Wedding Day," another of the popular series starring Lew Ayres and Lionel Barrymore, is the feature picture for today and tomorrow at the Capitol Theatre. 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
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
