OLD COUNTRY RUGBY GAMES Scotland Beat England, Winning Calcutta Cup—Final Position of the Four Countries Now Decided.

Scotland beat England by 8 points to 3 and so won the Calcutta cup, says an eastern exchange. This reverse was not in the least expected as Scotland had been twice defeated in international matches, whereas England had won both her games against Wales and Ireland. The final position of the four countries is that England and Ireland are bracketed top, while Scotland and Wales are bracketed bottom. In extension of England's single defeat it is only fair to say that she lost the services of one of her forwards, King, after only 12 minutes' play, while Johnson at fullback was also badly damaged, though he managed to play on.

PREPARING TO RECEIVE DUKE How Winnipeg is Going to Celebrate the Visit of the Governor General - Huge Torch-light Procession Planned

Preliminary arrangements for the reception to H. R. H. the Duke of Connaught and his suite on the occasion of the official visit of the governor-general to Winnipeg next July, were discussed at a meeting of the civic reception committee held yesterday. It is the intention to organize a citizens' committee which will take charge of all arrangements in co-operation with the exhibition association. An elaborate program, including a monster torch-light procession, is planned.

PRINCE ALBERT LIKE RUPERT Both "Prince" Cities Are Wrestling with Financial Problems and Debenture Issues at the Present Time.

Prince Albert, Sask., April 26.—The city council passed the following report of the finance committee which authorizes the sale of \$500,000 worth of city debentures at 93 net. G. H. Wood of Wood, Gundy & Co. appeared before the committee in finances. The city had for sale the following debentures: 1911 water works extensions, \$32,000; fire hall, \$16,000; storm sewers, \$14,500; electric light extensions, \$40,300; sidewalks, 1911, \$106,500; sewers, \$22,300; street grading, \$28,300. The following are to be voted on: Storm sewers, \$19,000; granolithic walks, \$21,500; water works, \$73,800; sewers, \$55,000; Y. W. C. A., \$5,300.

After a lengthy discussion of the financial outlook, Mr. Wood offered on behalf of his firm to take \$500,000 made up of \$125,000 power debentures and the balance selected from the above list, for which he offered 93 net, with accrued interest. In view of the present unsatisfactory condition of the securities market and the fact that the committee is of the opinion that there is no immediate prospect of any improvement, a recommendation was made that this offer be accepted.

He estimated that approximately 1,600,000 registered letters and packages had gone to the bottom.
