## POLITICAL SITUATION . . .

The result of the election yesterday is very confusing. Should the Conservatives decide to unite with the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation they can oust the Pattullo administration. If the Conservatives decide to throw in their lot with the Liberals they can form a union government. The third possibility is for the C. C. F. to support the present government but, as they have stood out so often for keeping the party out of alliances of any kind, it is almost unthinkable that they should now agree to join with either group.

It has been suggested that there was a loose agreement between leaders of the Conservatives and the C. C. F. not to oppose each other in several seats. That might indicate that they are prepared to unite in some governmental effort. However, the Pattullo government continues to carry on until they are either defeated in the Legislature or until they resign.




