Relative Health May Settle Sex

London Doctor Talks Of State Of Parents As Determining Factor

LONDON, May 2: (CP) - Sex of a child is the sex of the weaker of the two parties at the time of conception, Dr. Edward W. McCormick said in emphasizing the parental health theory on the predetermination of sex.

"It is nature's ingenious method of keeping the sexes in equal ratio, and by waiting until the one whose sex it ip required to duplicate is in a state of health below that of the other partner, the sex of the child may be predetermined," Dr. McCormick said.

Success of the method was dependent on duration of ill health at the time of conception and might prove of use where a male heir was essential.

Dr. McCormick quoted a case to show that nature is wiser than man. A famous athlete became the father of a boy although, according to the predetermination theory. it should have been a girl as the mother was ill. Six months later the hu band developed acute appendicitis.
