GOOD YEAR IN CHURCH

Reports to First United Congrega-
tion Show Excellent Position

Reports presented by various organizations at the annual congregational meeting of First United Church on Tuesday evening showed that the work of the church had been carried on with a great measure of success during the year.

Detailed reports were given for the different organizations. For the Sunday School Ken Harding, who also has a fine record for the Boys' work, reported the primary department and the Mission Band had been very successfully conducted by Mrs. E. A. Pilkington whose departure from the city has been a great loss. For the Canadian Girls in Training Mrs. Boardman had a fine report to present as had Mrs. Clarke McLean for the Young Ladies' Auxiliary. Mrs. E. T. Lock read the report for the Women's Missionary Society prepared by Mrs. G. N. Wilkinson whose departure had also been a severe loss to the church. Mrs. T. C. Wilding's report of the maintenance and missionary fund was a most gratifying one. Mrs. German, for the Women's Association, revealed how much the church owed to the ladies of the congregation. The work of Dr. E. E. Bailey for the Boys' Club came in for a word of special commendation.

The report of the treasurer, G. T. German, was received with great satisfaction. As a result of successful planning for some years and with the splendid co-operation of members and friends, not only had current expenses been met, but practically all the past debt had been liquidated. In addition the church had been renovated, the interior redecorated, the organ tuned and the staves painted. The members and the board of stewards had every reason to give thanks for such a happy state of affairs and the ensuing year was faced with courage and justifiable optimism. Tribute was paid to the fine work of E. T. Lock in building up the junior choir again and to J. E. Wilson for the good work of the senior choir. All joined in expressing their appreciation of the outstanding help given by Miss Swana O'Brien, whose work as organist was invaluable.

The report of the session, as given by the minister, Rev. J. C. Jackson, reviewed the year's work from a spiritual and also a material angle. The modest statements, hardly did justice to the fine work Mr. and Mrs. Jackson have done for the church and the community. The members are very grateful to the pastor for his leadership in all phases of church activities and this was freely expressed in a formal resolution accepting the report and more freely in the applause endorsing the same.
