



DRAMATIC DEMONSTRATION OF BRITISH SEA RESCUE



A demonstration of sea rescue work as conducted almost daily by the Air Sea Rescue Service of the R.A.F., is pictured here. The plane shown had dropped the rubber dinghy which, after being inflated, served as a float for a British pilot supposed to have been shot down. The plane then continued to hover over the spot after radioing directions to the high-speed rescue launch which is shown just as it reached the scene.
