government, retained his Commons seat for East Aberdeenshire after the committee in a report issued last January 21 found his conduct "derogatory to the dignity of the House." The committee said he had a financial interest in the realization of the assets, blocked in Britain after the Nazis invaded Czechoslovakia.

Boothby joined the R. A. F. as an observer in April, several weeks after Prime Minister Churchill in the debate on the committee's report told him: "One can only say that there are paths of service open in wartime which are not open in times of peace and some of these paths may be paths of honor." Only once did Boothby return to the Commons chamber after walking from it head bowed, when the debate ended. He was summoned back when a question of privilege was raised over an interview he gave in Scotland regarding the committee's report.

GLAMOR NOT
ALL GILDED

New York Grand-daughter Of Canadian Financier Had What It Takes But Eligibles Don't Want The Job

NEW YORK, July 16: (AP)—Gotham's Glamor Girl throne may gather dust after the marriage of Brenda Frazier to John Simms (Shipwreck) Kelly.

Brenda Frazier is the grand-daughter of Sir Frederick William Taylor, the Montreal banker.

In the first place, the candidates—Gloria Vanderbilt, Bettine Field and others—don't want the job. The debutantes have learned that there are tacks in that gilded chair.

In the second place, the girls of New York's social register families are taking a far more serious view of life than they did a few years ago. War work, charity, marriage and careers figure in their plans now—not \$25,000 debuts against a backdrop of orchids and colored balloons.

"I think the Glamor Girl title will die with Brenda," says pretty Esme O'Brien, who wore the crown before Miss Frazier, and who now is an eight-hour-a-day receptionist in the National Broadcasting company offices.

"Nobody can give the title what Brenda did. She had—and has—beauty, brains, poise and wit. But the title made her unhappy and she is glad to get rid of it. The other girls don't want it either. They've seen what Brenda and the rest had to suffer. Never any privacy, people staring at you everywhere you go, crazy letters in the mail.

Some Disadvantages

"As soon as you're labelled Glamor Girl people don't like you any more. They put you in the strip-tease class and make a laughing stock of you. The title cuts down your chances of getting a job by 50 percent. Professional people think you're trying to cash in on a big publicity build-up that you thought up yourself.

"Besides the boys aren't so fond of dating glamor girls any more. They're just starting their careers and they want to be taken seriously. They don't want the boss to open the morning paper and find pictures of them in a night club with a glamor girl.

"I think the word 'glamor' ought to be banned."

The girls who have worn the crown in the past and the debutantes who could inherit it, are seen

in much simpler settings than they were in the turbulent thirties. Brenda Frazier did not plan an elaborate wedding. The beautiful dark-haired heiress, whose debut was the most sumptuous affair of the 1938-39 season, will be married in a relatively simple ceremony attended only by members of the bridal couple's families.

Nor have the majority of this year's debts scheduled magnificent coming-out parties.
