UNCLE SAM STRONG ON MATERIALS

Washington Provides Means of Acquiring Rubber, Manganese and Other Products

 WASHINGTON, March 28: (CP)—Increased war tension in the Far East and the Balkans will not interfere with a government plan to accumulate substantial reserves of raw materials for the United States' expanding defence program, in the opinion of Jesse H. Jones, Federal Loan Administrator.

Since the Reconstruction Finance Corporation obtained powers from Congress to establish government-owned companies to acquire raw material reserves, substantial quantities of rubber, chrome, copper, graphite, manganese tin, antimony and other raw products have been bought.

Although orders have been placed for thousands of tons of these wartime necessities, deliveries have been comparatively slow. For instance, the government has purchased 280,000 tons of chrome, none has been delivered and only 7,200 tons are afloat. The balance, 252,800 tons, awaits shipment.

Similarly, manganese purchases total 2,307,700 tons but only 80,790 tons have been delivered and 97,895 tons are afloat. The same general picture is true of government purchases and deliveries of copper, tungsten, tin, antimony and graphite. Virtually all these metals are used in one form or another in the processing of steel.

Despite the big difference between purchases and deliveries, the S. government officials do not regard this as a great obstacle to the transactions. The Office of Production Management has placed machine tools on a materials list, reserving them for manufacturers engaged in orders. These moves are regarded as the forerunners to come in the near future, including the placing of orders on the priorities list.
