INSANE MAN'S HIDEOUS DEED Murders His Wife, Then Compels His Nine Year Old Son to Pull Trigger Slaying Him.

Meadville, Pa., May 1—Stephen Wellmon, 65 years old, a prosperous farmer of Lincolnville, Crawford County, near here shot and killed his wife, Sarah, 65 years old, in an upper room of their house this morning, and then in the kitchen forced his grandson, Grindson Wellmon, 9 years old, to kill him by blowing off the back of his head with the same shotgun with which the woman was killed.

The only account of the double tragedy came from the little boy after he had left the house of death and rushed across the fields to the residence of Ar-farmer.

"Grandfather killed Granny and then he made me kill him," he blurted out to Wheatman. "He shot grandmama upstairs and then came down and told me he would kill me if I did not shoot him dead. I didn't want to do it and started to run away, but he grabbed me and brought me back and told me he would shoot me if I did not do as he said. Then he laid the shotgun across a chair and knelt down and put his head against the muzzle. 'Pull the trigger,' he then told me, and I was afraid not to do it. I pulled the trigger and the gun went off. Then I ran over here."

Wellmon was released from the Warren County insane asylum only a year ago. It is said he was insanely jealous of his aged wife.

PRINCE ALBERT POWER SCHEME LaColle Falls to Provide 4,000 Horse Power for the Corporation to Convert to Revenue Production.

Prince Albert, May 1.—The city council approved an agreement between the city and the Ambursen Hydraulic Construction Co. of Montreal, under which actual construction work will begin in a few weeks on the La Colle Falls power scheme, in the carrying out of which Prince Albert will obtain 4,000 horse power in the city from the initial development. The contract which the company has undertaken involves the construction of a dam, head gates and the lock. The total cost of the works is estimated at \$578,000.
