second in strikeouts with 13, followed by Rudy York of Detroit, another long-ball-hitter, with 88. Joe Gordon, the Yankee World Series hero, struck out 80 times for third. There were 302 fewer strikeouts in the league in '41 than in '40.

Williams of the Red Sox was far out in front in drawing walks, with 145 in 143 games, followed by Roy Cullenbine of the Browns with 121 in 149 games. Others to draw over 100 strolls were Harland York wth 102 in 140 games. That the pitchers were a little wilder, or more cautious, in 1941 than in 11:00 a.m.-Festive Services. 1940 is indicated by the fact that Keller was high man in 1940 with 106 passes, and the league as a whole showed 245 more passes in 1941 than in 1940. Williams, the 1941 leader, drew 96 passes in 144 games in 1940, as compared to his 145 walks in one less game in '41.

Although there were more passes in the league in 1941 than in 1940, there were fewer hit batsmen, the totals showing 151 men plunked with the pellet in 1940 and 148 in 1941. Frank Crosetti of the Yankees had led the league for five straight years in taking it somewhere on the body until! 1941 when Dominic DiMaggio of the Red Sox was rocked seven times.
