VERY FINE BUILDING

Whifflets From The Waterfront

Under a change which is being made in the Canadian National Steamships coastal service effective the week after next, the Wednesday boat north of Prince Rupert will make the weekly call at Stewart instead of the Friday boat. The Wednesday boat will arrive here from the south as usual at 10 o'clock in the morning and sail at 3 p.m. for Ketchikan and Stewart, returning to Prince Rupert at 8 o'clock Thursday night and sailing south at 11:15 p.m. The boat north from here on Friday will eliminate the Stewart call, going only to Ketchikan. She will arrive here at 10 o'clock Friday mornings, sail at 10 p.m. for Ketchikan, return here at 6 o'clock Saturday evening and sail at 11:15 p.m. for Vancouver. It is also announced that the Wednesday sailings out of Vancouver on Dec. 24 and Jan. 1 will be set back one day, the boats arriving here on Saturdays instead of Fridays on Christmas and New Year weeks and operating one day later throughout the voyage.

C.P.R. steamer Princess Norah, Capt. William Palmer, is due in port at 3:30 this afternoon from Alaska and will sail at 5 p.m. for Vancouver.
