PASSING OF

former Director of Colonization and Agriculture of C.N.R.

MONTREAL, Dec. 23:-Dr. W. J. Black, formerly director of colonzation and agriculture, Canadian National Railways, died yesterday at his residence, 625 Murray Hill Ave., Westmount. Death was unexpected as Dr. Black had been fairly active of late.

Surviving are Mrs. Black, the former Ida Maude Day, of Creenore, Ont., Miss Willa Black, laughter at home, and one son, Pilot Officer J. George Black, Royal Canadian Air Force, stationed at Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island; also one sister. Mrs. T. McCreery, a resident of Toronto.

Nov. 29, 1872, and after the usual particularly in relation to new training which comes to boys on Canadians. farms, he studied at and graduated from Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, Ont. His initial venture was in agricultural journalism and between 1902 and 1904 he served as editor-in-chief of The Farmers' Advocate, Winnipeg, the Manitoba government, becoming deputy minister of agriculture and immigration, and in 1905 organized and became president of the Manitoba Agriculture College. the first institution of its kind in western Canada. This position he occupied until 1915 when he was appointed commissioner of agriculture for Canada, later becoming chairman of the soldiers' settle-

ment board. In 1921 he was appointed deputy minister, department of immigration and colonization, for the Dominion government. With the development of the Canadian National Railways and the initiation of a special department of colonization, Mr. Black accepted an invitation to join the railway service and in 1923 organized that work and began as European manager of the department of colonization and
