With the possible exception of a few scattered but unexpected American catches which may yet arrive and some small landings incidental to cod fares, the season for halibut landings at Prince Rupert is practically ended with this week during which the catches brought in aggregated 291,000 pounds of which 211,000 pounds were from American vessels and 80,000 pounds from Canadian. This brings the landings for the season up to a total of 15,556,000 pounds as compared with 16,318,319 pounds at a corresponding date last year. The aggregate of American fish for this season is 9,903,900 pounds as against 10,197,100 pounds last year while the American total is 5,656,100 pounds in comparison with 6,121,219 pounds. Prices held up at a steady level during the week with the top bid for American fish 12.4c and 11c and the low 11.5c and 11c. Three Canadian boats landed catches during the week and all received 12c and 10.5c.

The C.N.R. steamer Prince Rupert, Capt. Neil MacLean, and C.P.R. steamer Princess Adelaide, Capt. R. C. McGeachy, arrived in port together at 11 o'clock yesterday morning, both being from Vancouver. The Princess Adelaide sailed at 2 p.m. on her return to Vancouver and waypoints. The Prince Rupert sailed at 4 p.m. for Ketchikan and Stewart whence she will return here southbound this evening.

The tug Hayak arrived in port this morning with another load of lumber for the Ryan Construction Company.

John Richardson, local fisherman, left on last evening's train for Halifax. He will spend the winter at his native home in Nova Scotia.

**UNMINDFUL OF DANGER**

Speeding Up Everywhere in War Effort Needed, Declares Mr. Justice Manson.

Speaking of the United States, in his address before the Prince Rupert Rotary Club on Thursday, Mr. Justice A. M. Manson remarked that, even if the enemy guns were heard in their own country, Lindbergh and Wheeler would not realize the situation.

**Slowing Down**

In this country and that men in factories were slowing down, not caring that it meant death to their own countrymen. However, it was easy to be an armchair critic. Much of the criticism was unjustified. He knew this from first hand knowledge. Many imputed disloyalty to the government but those who did that were the worst kind of snakes.

It was not uncommon to hear it said that it was impossible for Russia to go down. He himself did not think it possible that Russia could be beaten but it was not wise to be too sure. The way to win the war was to take part in the struggle, to make sacrifices. He referred to the need for holding down on the gas for that would save the lives of men overseas.

Turning to the after the war problems, Judge Manson said he hoped there would be a tomorrow. After the last war they had muddled through. After this war it would be different. When industry closed down there would be millions out of employment. The problem of taking care of them was greater than that of caring for the returned soldiers.

Judge Manson said, in summing up, that the largest number of men in some of the shipyards were young men. Young women would have to take over some of the work and release the men. The war was not won yet and would not be until every man did his part and the indifference of the past had been forgotten. Men


