## Timely Recipes

### GRAPE JELLY

4 cups (2 lbs.) juice  
7½ cups (3¼ lbs.) sugar  
½ bottle fruit pectin.  
To prepare juice, stem about 3 pounds fully ripe grapes and crush thoroughly. Add ½ cup water, bring to a boil, cover, and simmer 10 minutes. Place fruit in jelly cloth or bag and squeeze out juice. (If Malagas or other tight-skinned grapes are used, the juice of 1 lemon should be added to prepared juice). Measure sugar and juice into large saucepan and mix. Bring to a boil over hottest fire and at once add fruit pectin, stirring constantly. Then bring to a full rolling boil and boil hard ½ minute. Remove from fire, skim, pour quickly. Paraffin and cover at once. Makes about 11 glasses (6 fluid ounces each).
