Montana Man Wins Scottish House Contest

VICTORIA, July 11.—George H. Davey of Twin Bridges, Montana, was the winner of a five-room bungalow in Victoria which was raffled by the Women's Auxiliary to the Canadian Scottish Regiment. His lucky ticket was No. 8700. Some 80,000 tickets, representing 19,000 purchasers, were sold throughout Canada and the United States, the net proceeds amounting to about \$14,000. A check for \$7000 has been forwarded to the Lord Mayor's Fund and the balance will be used for general comforts fund of the regiment.

WINS MEDAL FOR HEROISM

Royal Canadian Humane Association Recognizes Bravery Of Bella Coola Man

HAMILTON, July 31: (CP)—Andrew Siwallace of Bella Coola, has been awarded the bronze medal of the Royal Canadian Humane Association for gallantry in saving the life of Joseph Saunders, November 29, 1940.

Siwallace was waiting for Saunders at the mouth of the Bella Coola River when he saw a piece of the river bank break away and partially bury Saunders who was setting traps nearby. The Bella Coola man swam across the river and was attempting to free Saunders when a second slide occurred. Siwallace was then forced to jump into the river and when he came up Saunders had almost disappeared. He got Saunders head clear but could not lift him from the silt and mud. Thinking quickly, Siwallace took a board from a dinghy for Saunders to hold, placed the board so that the man could rest with his head on it, and swam 75 feet to the north side of the river. Siwallace then went to the Bella Coola Indian village for help and with three other men paddled across the river to rescue Saunders.

Another bronze medal was awarded to MacRae Clouston of Huntingdon, Quebec. Clouston was a passenger in a car driven by Miss Evelyn Marie Delisle which dropped about 10 feet through a bridge approach guard and landed upside-down in the River Laguerre July 21, 1940. Clouston managed to get Miss Delisle through a window of the car to safety.

drowning in the Bella Coola River, December 5, 1940.

John Poplenko, Kamloops, for the rescue of Donal Rawson from drowning in the Thompson River, North Kamloops, December 14, 1940.

Margaret Ida Triggs, Nelson, for the rescue of Ronald Edey from drowning in Kootenay Lake, Nelson, August, 1940.

Douglas Scott Lesley and Gordon Welsley Kirkby, both of Prince Albert, for assisting in the rescue of Philip Powis from drowning at Nels' Beach, Emma Lake, June 30, 1940.

Dennis Furness, West Kildonan, for the rescue of Winnifred Lee from drowning at West Kildonan, August 16, 1940.

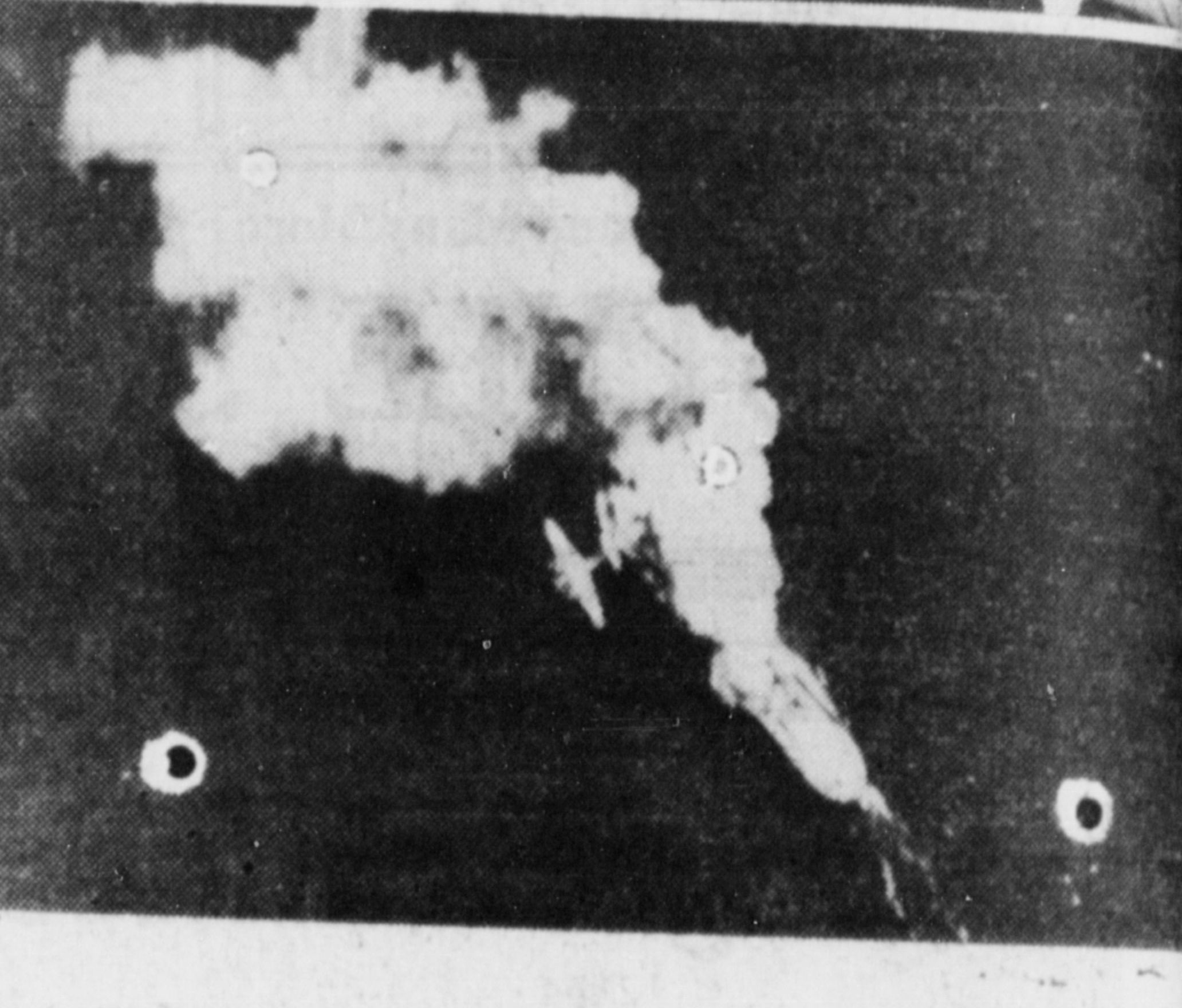

Following Up Housing Plan

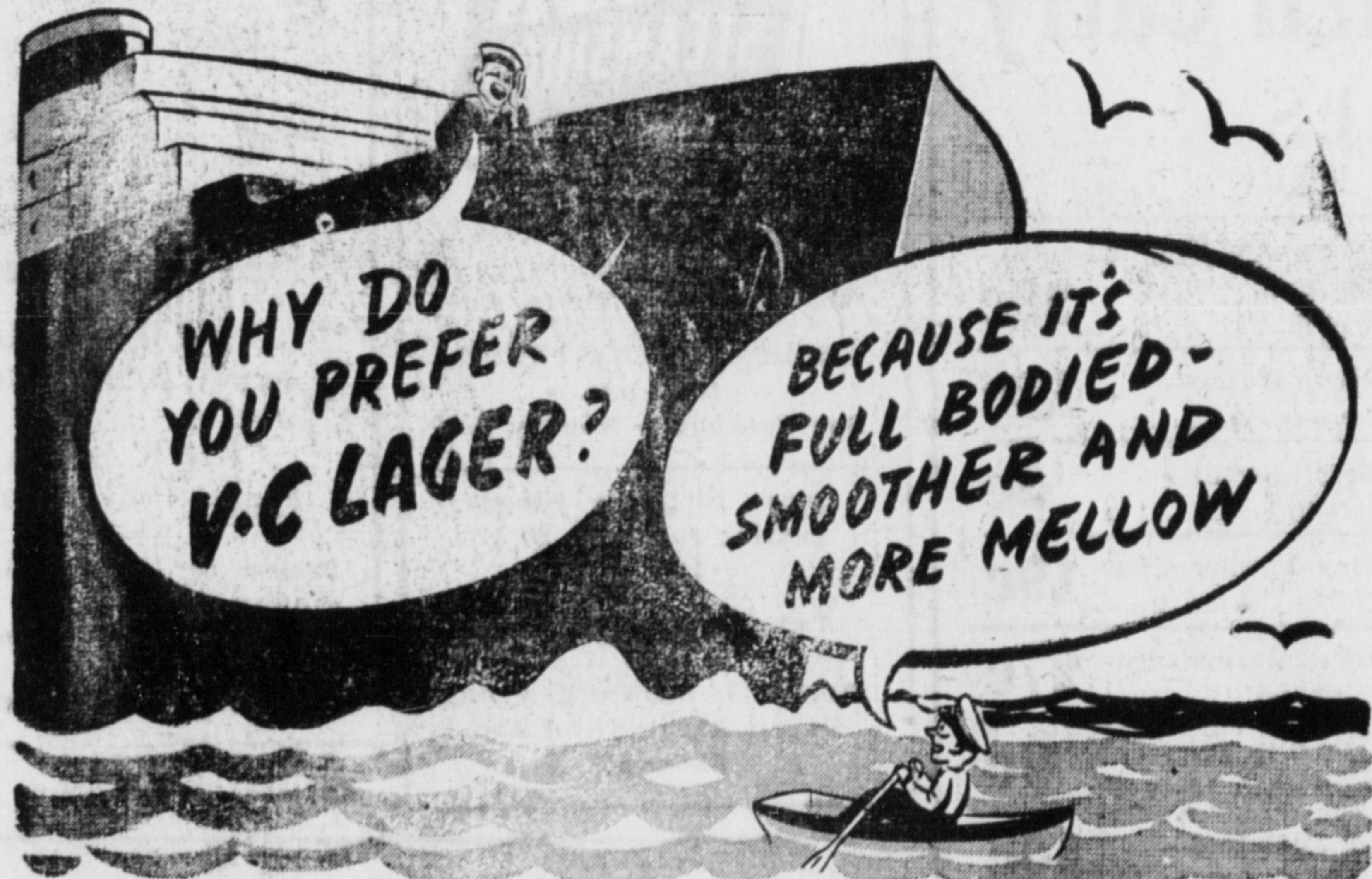
Provincial Official to Interview Federal Housing Inc. in Toronto
