Waterfront Whiffs

Two Undertakings Attracting Attention
On Local Waterfront Just Now—
Dog Fish Centre of Waterfront Discussion Now.

Two undertakings at present attracting attention on the local waterfront are an imposing new ship-building shed being built at the Matsumoto yard in Cow Bay and a further addition to the cold storage plant of the Northern Fishermen's Cold Storage. The new big shed for Matsumoto has been found necessary to take care of new

contracts for larger fishing vessels which are being worked on. It is being built right over the old shed. The new unit of the Northern Fishermen's Cold Storage adjoins that part of the plant just across the road from the main plant and a piece of hill had to be dug out in order to make way for it.

With the present price of dog-fish livers at 15 cents a pound the fishing is found to be profitable and many of the local hall-but boats which planned to tie up for the winter have turned to fishing dog-fish. Over twenty boats are either out fishing or outfitting to go fishing within a few days. The fishing is not yet established as a profitable industry but some boats that have been out have found it profitable, sufficiently so to induce others to try it. The boats that are out or going out are Joe Baker, Teeny Milly, Lois N., Morris H., Gony, Fihella, Annabelle, Arctic I, Ankar A, Neptune, Borgund, Ingrid H. Balsac, I.H., Viking, Ed. Lipsett, Northern Breeze, Robert B., Mae West, Clipper II, Dove B.

Possibly this fishing will keep the boats busy until herring fishing commences. Just now there are three firms buying livers, the J. H. Carson Company, Atlin Fisheries and Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co.

Local fishermen have become somewhat excited over what they are doing in the south. It seems that the schooner Viking of Seattle, Captain Adolph Stenland, went out and caught five tons of Soup Fin Shark which was sold for \$6000. She had a crew of four men and was out for only five days, and took her catch to San Francisco where it was sold. Evidently there was a real demand for livers that week.

The part of the waterfront in the neighborhood of the shipyard is becoming somewhat changed recently. The yard has been pushed over as part of a process of enlarging the dry dock yard space while the Imperial Oil siding has been diverted to the other side of the main railway track, part of the waterfront of the J. H. Carson Company and all the rest of the Imperial Oil property has been diverted for naval use and so far two buildings have been erected. The whole appearance of the place has been changed and will be changed more soon.

Steamer Camosun is expected to arrive from the Islands early in the week.

Steamer Cardena arrived here during the night and left early this morning for the Skeena River where she had to discharge 50,000 feet of lumber and after that will take on a full cargo of canned salmon.

Steamer Princess Norah is replacing the Princess Louise for the winter months and is expected to arrive here Monday morning, continuing on the Skagway service during the winter months.

Clark Gable and Rosalind Russell in "They Met in Bombay" Coming Monday.

Combining the versatile talents of Clark Gable and Rosalind Russell as co-stars, the romantic melodrama "They Met in Bombay" comes as the feature offering to the screen of the Capitol Theatre on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of next week.
