FOR LIFE SAVING ON STEAMSHIPS

Great German Companies in Conference with Program Personally Drawn Up by Kaiser on Life Saving Devices.

Berlin, May 14.—Representatives of all the German steamship companies and of ship builders, marine architects, etc., held a conference under the chairmanship of Herr Del Brueck, the minister of interior, concerning the perfection of plans for the saving of life at sea.

The report showed that between 80 and 90 per cent. of the German crews were able to swim and row life boats. There was no criticism of the existing steamship routes, but it was thought that in fogs or when in close proximity to ice the speed of vessels should be reduced.

REAL ESTATE MAN'S FRAUD

Sentence of Six Months' Imprisonment Passed Upon C. E. Hoffman for Flagrant Misappropriation.

Calgary, May 13.—Six months' imprisonment with hard labor was the sentence passed by Police Magistrate Saunders on Charles E. Hoffman, a real estate operator, who was arrested some days ago on a charge of fraud.

From the evidence at the trial it appears that the accused, to get rich quick, was not satisfied with the ordinary commission, but sacrificed the interests of the man Grant, for whom he was acting as agent.

NEW YORK EATS A BILLION EGGS

Thirty Million Pounds of Cheese and Seventy-two Million Pounds of Butter Consumed in Less Than a Year.

New York, May 11.—The marketing committee of the State food investigation commission here reports that each year New York consumes between 1,296,000,000 and 1,440,000,000 eggs and that before now there have been put away in cold storage warehouses 319,800,000.

Last year the market for cheese was considered unusually poor, but in spite of that fact the amount consumed in the city was 30,000,000 pounds.

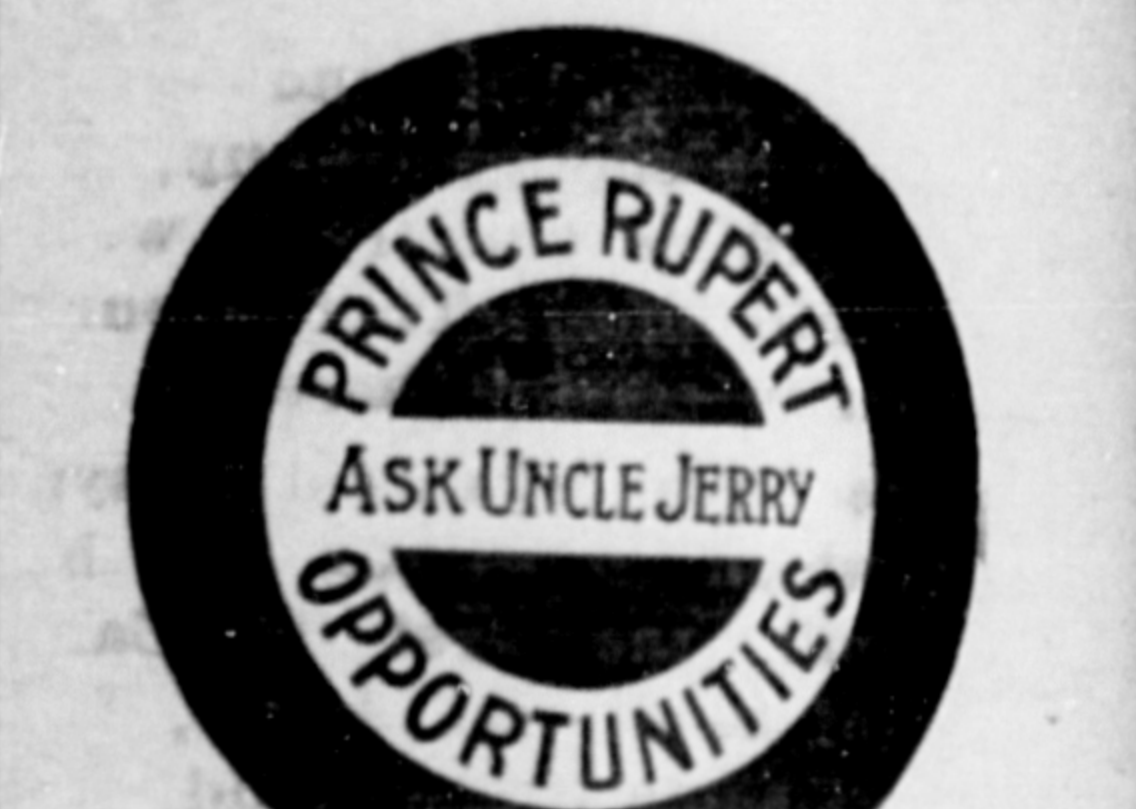
