



In order to permit of escapement of fish, Skidegate Inlet will be closed to fishing at the end of this week. Canneries still operating in the Skeena River area are Cassiar, Inverness, Claxton, Carlisle and Prince Rupert (Nelson Bros.) Sunnyside on the Skeena River and Wales Island and Arrandale on the Naas River are already closed. North Pacific on the Skeena will close this week-end.


