INDIANS AT SINGAPORE

SINGAPORE-Great Britain's Imperial army in Malaya received new and strong reinforcements today with the arrival of Indian Army units fully motorized and bringing all fighting equipment with them.

BERLIN AND FRANKFURT HIT

LONDON-Waves of Royal Air Force planes swept over the English Channel last night and early today to continue the round the clock offensive by blasting Berlin, parts of southwestern Germany and Nazi-occupied France. Berlin and Frankfurt were the main objectives. At Frankfurt a severe attack was made on railway lines and industrial targets. Large bombs fell on industrial buildings in Berlin and great fires were observed as British bombers set their course for home. Nine Royal Air Force planes were lost.

NAZIS NEARING LENINGRAD

BERLIN-German sources claimed today that fierce Russian resistance and adverse weather has failed to blunt the spearhead of the Nazi drive on Leningrad which they say is now within twenty miles of the city and moving steadily forward.

Germans back with heavy losses Internal Struggle Between Extremists And Moderates Is Indicated

> SHANGHAI, Sept. 3: (P)—Japan was reported reliably today to be in the throes of an internal struggle between the German-goaded extremists and the realistic moderates over how best to achieve unchallenged Oriental dominance which the Japanese regard as their ordained world role.

According to reliable foreigners. the Konoye government must either yield to the extremists or face the possibility of a violent overthrow since it is said the supuse force.
