

The Original, as it was called, costing less than £150, was rendered buoyant by about 7cwt, of cork. It knew nothing of automatic valves for emptying out water as fast as it pours in. It was just an open boat, with no source of buoyancy but this cork; no means of ridding itself of water, save by baling; and no means of propulsion other than oars— but it rescued hundreds of lives.

Indeed, so highly satisfactory was the lifeboat that, in 1798, the Duke of Northumberland had endowed, that in 1300 he ordered another for Oporto. In the same year Cathcart Demster ordered yet an-, other for St. Andrews.

Recognition
