Whifflets From The Waterfront

With a large list of passengers on board, consisting largely of Alaskans and Yukoners going south for the winter, C.P.R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. S. K. Gray, arrived in port at 3:15 this afternoon from Skagway and other northern points and sailed at 5 p.m. for Vancouver. The passenger list of the Princess Louise totaled 253 of whom twenty-three disembarked at Prince Rupert while three went aboard at this port. The through list consisted largely of White Pass and Yukon route employees including river boat crews, among them Captains D. M. McKay, J. Gardner, M. Marston, M. Campbell, C. M. Coughlan and Ewan Morrison and Chief Engineers John Scotland and F. L. Young.

The season for the shooting of geese and ducks opened in this district at the end of the week. Despite stormy weather, a few parties went forth to try their luck. Bags, evidently, were not very substantial. B. J. Bacon, president of the Prince Rupert Rod & Gun Club, and his friend, A. K. Nelson, were out. They made no boasts but explained that the local birds had not yet arrived from the interior because the weather was mild there. The flight southward of the northern birds continues but they do not seem to tarry in the vicinity of Prince Rupert.

Word is being awaited from the Queen Charlotte Islands as to the progress which has been made in connection with the raising of the local halibut boat Unome, Capt. Bert Sheppard, which sank recently while engaged in fishing for dogfish in Massett Inlet, about ten miles above Massett. A week ago last Sunday Capt. William Bussey left for Massett Inlet with a view to assisting Capt. Sheppard.

Union steamer Catala, Capt. Ernest Sheppard, is due in port at 4:30 this afternoon from Stewart and other northern points and will sail soon thereafter in continuation of her voyage to Vancouver and waypoints.
