



ISOLATION HOSPITAL

Hospital Board And Medical Association To Meet City Commissioner On Matter

A delegation representing the board of directors of the Prince Rupert General Hospital and the Prince Rupert Medical Association will interview City Commissioner D. J. Matheson with a view to having isolation hospital facilities resumed. This was decided last night at the regular monthly meeting of the board of directors of the Prince Rupert General Hospital.

The isolation situation was brought up by Dr. R. G. Large who referred to the additional cost involved by the general hospital having to handle isolation cases to say nothing of the risk of infection. Recently both scarlet fever and diphtheria cases had been handled in the general hospital and this had given rise to some very disagreeable publicity by word of mouth.

Dr. Large felt that the city should assume some responsibility in connection with treatment of isolation cases and the board seemed to be in full agreement with this view.

Hospital Maids' Home Given Up

Present Arrangement For Housing To Be Discontinued After First Of Year

After the first of the year the Prince Rupert General Hospital will discontinue the present arrangement of operating a maids' home and girls in this department of the hospital service will be required to find their own accommodation outside. In lieu of the home, they will be given \$10 a month extra salary.

Recommendation that the maids' home be discontinued was made by President Frank Dibb who told of present unsatisfactory conditions.

Lease on the house at Hays Cove Circle and Fifth Avenue at present being used will be relinquished.

It was left to the lady superintendent and the managing secretary to make the change.


