WOODS WAS

Publisher Of Calgary Herald Was Known Throughout Canada And Empire

Noted Canadian journalist and editor and publisher, publisher of the Cargary Herald, who is dead, James Rossaick Woods, became known throughout the Empire and j abroad a, an apostle of trade for Canada and as chairman of the Canadian section of the Empire! Press Union including in his membership newspapers and periodicals throughout the Empire.

For many years he travelled widely both as a newspaperman sponsoring better knowledge of Imperial affairs and as an ambassador of trade. He was for a term head of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce. An eloquent and persua ive speaker, witty and forceful, he addressed important, audiences in many countries during visits to Australia, the Orient, South Africa, Great Britain, Europe, South America, Washington, D. C., and all parts of the Dom-

Perhaps his most notable speech was at the Guildhall on July 17,1 1918. He was chairman of the party of Canadian newspapermen who went to Britain and France as guests of the government for the purp e of reviewing the war efforts, visiting the West Front battlefields and the great munitions factories, as well as the Grand Fleet at Scapa Flow.
