**Government Means to Enforce Strictly New Regulations in Regard to Price Ceilings.**

OTTAWA, Nov. 22: — Donald Gordon, new chairman of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board, says that, now the government has embarked upon it, the intention is to make the price ceiling program in Canada stick, preferably by co-operation but, if necessary, by compulsion. The level of prices to the consumers must not be increased and, if deemed necessary, prices will be ordered reduced. Everything will be done to prevent essential businesses and services from going to the wall.
