CANADIAN CLUB LUNCHEON

Dr. Alfred Thompson Was Guest of Honor at Yesterday's Function, First for Season This Year—Instructive Address.

As president of the Canadian Club Judge Young at yesterday's gathering of the club members to hear Dr. Alfred Thompson remarked that the club had had a period of quiescence which he expected would be ended this season when a large number of important personages were expected to visit Prince Rupert. They would be invited to address the Canadian Club. Dr. Thompson's address was a most interesting one, dealing with the Alaska trade and its importance to Prince Rupert, also the importance of the Yukon Territory's gold output, which should soon pour through Prince Rupert. Dr. Thompson mentioned that he hoped at next session of parliament to endeavor to have matters set in motion for the securing of Alaska by a system of barter of other properties with the United States. Whether this will be effected or not he could not predict, but he hoped it would.

IMMIGRATION SCHEME EAST

Plan by Which Settlers Will Own Their Own Farms After a Period of Payments.

A new departure in immigration has been made by an eastern company. Five thousand acres were purchased in Kent County, at Jeanette, near Tilbury, a year ago. This land consists of part of the famous St. Clair flats, very rich in alluvial mould over a clay subsoil. It has hitherto been farmed chiefly by French-Canadians, and not by any means exploited to its full capacity. The promoters have divided 5,000 acres into garden lots of ten acres each, upon which specially designed cottages are being erected. British settlers are to be brought out to occupy these truck farms, the first party of whom have already arrived. The plan is that they shall own their farms, paying for them in ten annual instalments. LAYING OUT HISTORIC SOIL

Work Started on Quebec Battlefields Park Now After Three Years' Delay—Machinery Coming from England.

Quebec, May 21.—The work necessary in connection with the Quebec Battlefields Park is to be proceeded with this summer, after a delay of more than three years.

The first step has been taken by the employment of a number of men on the Plains of Abraham at the work of making ready the ground to erect a shed in which the necessary machinery will be housed. This machinery is already ordered from England and comprises a portable engine, a steam crusher, steam roller, steam grinder and revolving sieve to pass stone through scrapers, etc., all of the most modern type. The Federal government voted the sum of \$114,500 last session.
