## WAR ALARM IN RUPERT

A. R. F. to Have General Practice  
On Sunday Night

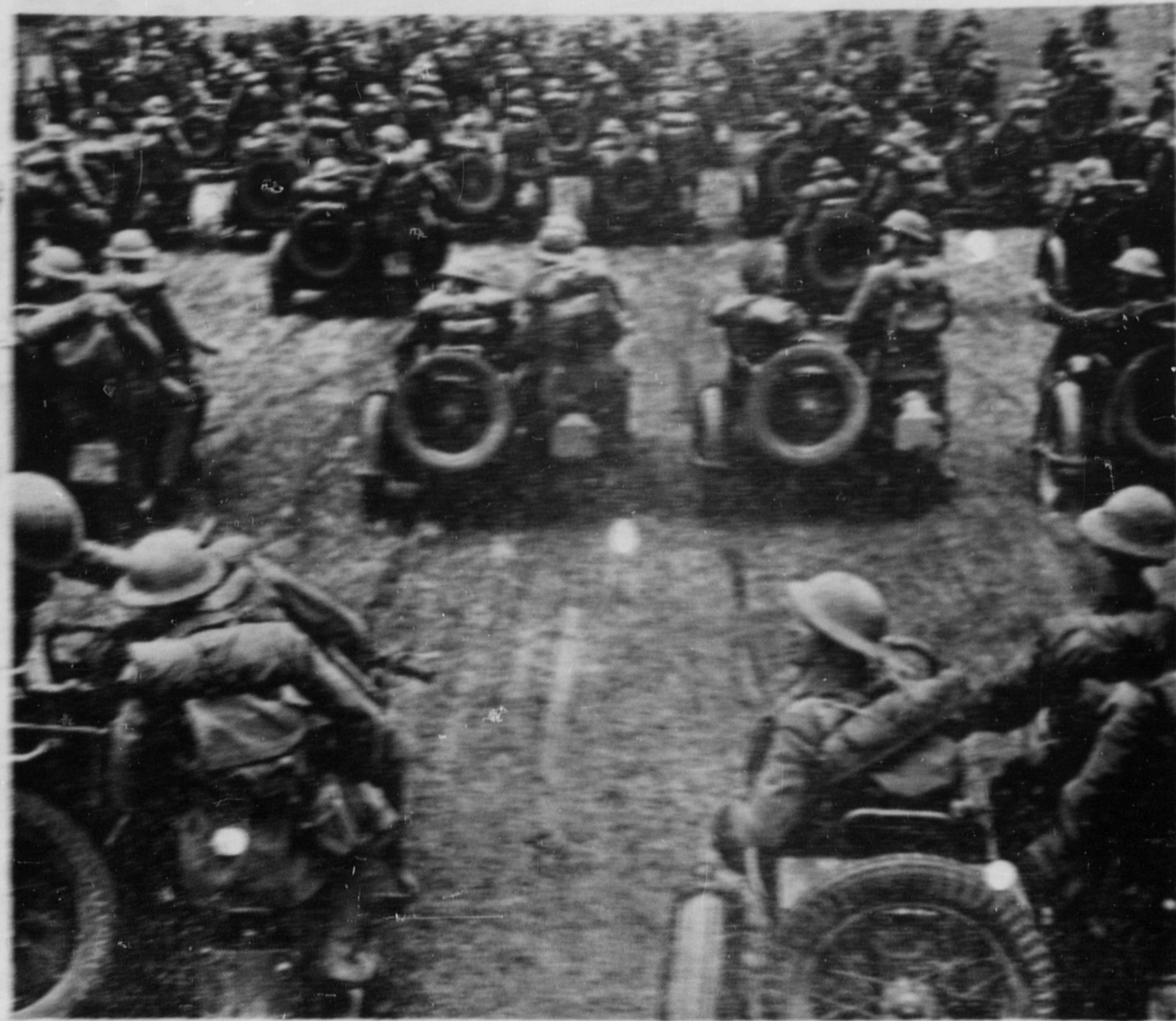
As a result of meetings of the sub-committee of the Prince Rupert Civil Protection Air Raid Protection committee held on Sunday and last evening plans have been completed for a trial practice on Sunday afternoon next. Events in many parts of the city have emphasized the need for preparedness and in order of public safety, the local committee under the general chairmanship of J. J. Little have done a great amount of quiet preparation. Sunday afternoon's experiment will be the first of a series of practices aimed at finding the weak points in carrying out the plans and then rectifying these.

Those in attendance at the meetings included representatives of the naval, military and air force services. Civilian departments were the district and city police units, who will have their special police reserve on active duty; the city fire department, engineering units, decontamination and demolition squads, fire and police with assistance, and the Prince Rupert Legion Defence Corps. The latter organization will not be required for Sunday's practice but will be called on at a later date. Members of the Boy Scout and Sea Cadet troops will be used as runners in conveying messages to and from headquarters.

The general alarm will be given by various means — the fire bell, church bells, factory sirens and telephones. Members of organizations taking part will wear headbands and badges showing that they are officially entitled to take charge where necessary.

The general civilian population is being asked to co-operate by leaving all means of communication and traffic available for the committee. Referees will be appointed to judge the effectiveness of the try-out and constructive expert criticism will enable improvements to be made. There are vacancies in some of the organizations and offers of help from the general public are being invited.

## REPORTED TO BE RAIDING GERMAN-OCCUPIED FRANCE



It was reported in New York that British motor-cycle troops, forming "suicide" squadrons, have made lightning raids into occupied France during recent weeks, harassing German forces and bringing back valuable information. They are said to have been based in France across the Channel in trawlers and fishing boats. While no immediate military objective is served, the raids are said to be staged for the effect on German morale and for the capture of prisoners from whom information is elicited.
