# This Is Statement of Soviet General In Appeal to Stand

Citizens of Russia's Second City Exhorted to do Holy Duty —Is Focal Point of Nazi Attack

MOSCOW, August 23: (CP)— Marshal Klementi Voroshilov, defender of Leningrad, repeated urgent proclamations today declaring that the Soviet's second city was in "terrible danger" and urging Soviet citizens to perform their "holy duty" of fighting off the Nazi invader. The Soviet communique had by inference, however, re-
