EDITORIAL

What About Cleaning Up? - - -

The Junior Chamber of Commerce, assisted by the Prince Rupert Horticultural Society, is carrying out a clean-up campaign during the week commencing today and ending on Saturday of next week. During that time it hopes to see the city made much more attractive than it is today. There are ash piles that should be removed, rubbish of various kinds lying about, back lanes in a rather disreputable condition and general need of a little tidying up everywhere.

Also there is trimming and tidying that might be done in and around the gardens, all of which would tend to make the city more attractive to visitors.

During the coming summer it is expected that there will be a large number of tourists visiting Prince Rupert. They take photographs. While some of them select the beauty spots, others look out for the eyesores and picture them as horrible examples of what should not be. They are shown in lecture tours and people are told about them everywhere.

Prince Rupert has made a good beginning. The Railway company, the provincial government and the city have done good work along the line of improving their properties. Many have cultivated gardens in different parts of the city. Every year sees great improvements. What the young men of the city are asking is that every resident co-operate in this movement. It is a great work and in a few years should bring permanent results. We suggest that each person who reads this or hears about the movement should join in the campaign.

Another Good Work - - -

Another good work that is going on throughout Canada is the subscribing of money for the air raid sufferers of Great Britain. Many of them are today homeless. Many are maimed and in hospitals. There are widows and orphans without any of the comforts of life except those provided by their neighbors. It is to help these that the Queen's Canadian Fund was started and subscriptions throughout the country are coming in well. We can commend this fund as being one of the most useful funds for which people are subscribing.

Nurses Required To Give Notice

Correspondence Read Before Local Board in Regard to Manner of Leaving Employment

In regard to the matter of nurses leaving their positions without giving sufficient notice of impending departure the Prince Rupert General Hospital board, at its meeting last night, had correspondence from the British Columbia Hospitals' Association, the Registered Nurses' Association of British Columbia and the Kelowna General Hospital. The British Columbia Hospitals' Association suggested that, when nurses left without due notice, they not be paid for what time they had worked during the month. Miss Helen Randal R.N., registrar of the Graduate Nurses' Association, suggested that an undertaking be received from nurses on joining the staff to give sufficient notice. The matter would be taken up with the council of the Association, Miss Randal said. The Kelowna General Hospital Association had no knowledge of nurses having come there without giving due notice where they had been leaving.
