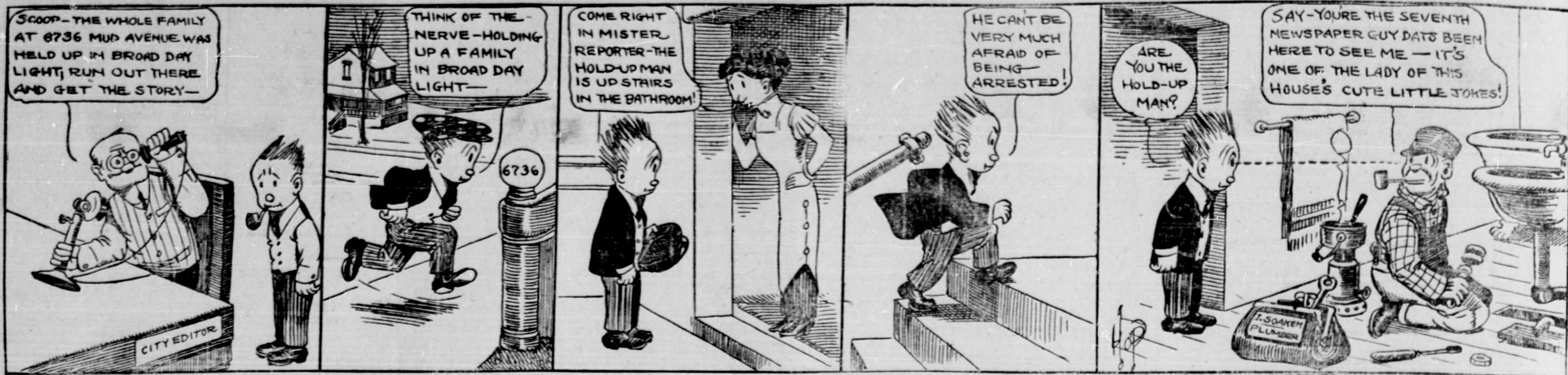


## Wherein Scoop Interviews a Hold-Up Man in Broad Daylight
