HALIBUTERS

Many Advantages Are Claimed for

KETCHIKAN, April 4.—The first commercial tests of antiseptic ice in the halibut, fishery will be conducted in Ketchikan it was learned from Charles F. Shockey, instructor in biology at Seattle Pacific college and representative of the manufacturers of the powder used in mak-

Mr. Shockey has made arrangements for local halibut vessels to try the ice. They include the J.B. operated by John Bogen, and the Atlas, John Monsen. The pish is avnected that the Seattle boat Coolidge will take on antiseptic ice on its second trip to the fishing banks.

Tests run at Seattle Pacific College by Shockey show a reduction bilge water of the troller Seal of Seattle salmon fleet amounted to 63 per cent, although the hold of previous to taking on board the an-

The ice is produced by the addition of a small amount of certain antiseptic powders to the water to e frozen. The antiseptic properties of this ice is not destroyed by freezing and it is stable even in the presence of organic substances when melted. It is not toxic and it does not discolor the fish flesh, he
